**Analysis of Selected Third Quarter 2009 Industry Sector Changes: July - September**

**\*Construction:** There were overall gains of 200 jobs: Building Equipment Contractors gained 300 jobs and Construction of Buildings - Residential gained 100 jobs and Nonresidential Building Construction lost 200 jobs.

**\*Manufacturing:** There were overall gains of 600 jobs: Durable Goods gained 300 jobs primarily in Durable Goods - Residual and Nondurable Goods gained 300 jobs primarily in Non-Durable Goods - Residual.

**\*Health Services:** There were overall gains of 400 jobs, primarily in Ambulatory Health Care Services.

**\*Retail Trade:** There were overall losses of 100 jobs: Clothing & Accessories Stores and Grocery Stores showed the biggest losses at 300 jobs and 200 jobs respectively.

**\*Leisure & Hospitality:** There were overall losses of 1,200 jobs: 500 in Arts, Entertainment, & Recreation and 700 in Food Services & Drinking Places.

**\*Government:** There were overall gains of 2,000 jobs, primarily in Local Government Education with 4,300 jobs.

**\*Professional & Business Services:** There were overall losses of 1,700 jobs: 700 in Professional, Scientific, & Technical Services; 300 in Management of Companies & Enterprises, & 700 in Administrative & Support & Waste Services.
