The <u>Employment & Human Services Department (EHSD</u>) welcomes and serves all Contra Costa County community members and wants them to know about the benefits, services, and resources that may be available for their families.

EHSD Welcomes You to Contra Costa County is a brochure that outlines our department's many programs. Anybody, including refugees, immigrants, and all Contra Costa residents, can apply for benefits and services. The brochure has information and contact details related to health care services, food resources, jobs, housing, protective services for children and adults, and more.

In addition to <u>English</u>, the "EHSD Welcomes You" brochure is available in <u>Spanish</u>, <u>Chinese</u> (traditional), Chinese (simplified), Tagalog, Farsi, Korean, Vietnamese, Dari, and Pashto.

Not everyone is eligible for all programs, but many resources are in place to support, protect and empower individuals and families on their paths to self-sufficiency.
